The purpose of the Fingerprint occupation is to classify fingerprint cards, identify incoming fingerprint cards, maintain section of master files, correct misclassified master fingerprint cards & initiate research by using the Henry Classification System & National Crime Information Center methods of identifying prints via computer or manual system.

At the lower levels, incumbents receive instruction &/or perform the duties of identifying prints in order to classify, identify, file & fingerprint individuals. At the higher level, incumbents perform specialized Identification tasks & train lower level Fingerprint Technicians & Examiners.

Conducts searches & comparisons of single inked fingerprints on checks & other documents.

Provides work direction & training over lower level Fingerprint Technicians & Fingerprint Examiners. Reviews activities to insure accuracy & completeness of work performed & disseminates information to authorized agencies.

Provides training to law enforcement officers & civilian employers in fingerprint identification techniques & related identification problems; provides record checks for law enforcement agencies & other approved agencies or individuals by telephone or face-to-face contacts; responds to needs of the law enforcement community in related matters which are complex & confidential; conducts tours of facilities & testifies in court when subpoenaed.
