JOB DUTIES IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE: (These duties are illustrative only. Incumbents may perform some or all of these duties or other job-related duties as assigned.)

Mixes, pours, lays & finishes concrete, repairs & replaces concrete sidewalks, floors, walls, steps &/or other similar structures, lays brick, blocks &/or tile, reads blueprints & masonry plans, sets marker stakes & makes forms.

Performs or assists other trades or areas in performance of miscellaneous tasks (e.g., minor carpentry, plastering or plumbing work, repair of roofs, doors, walls, windows or screens, repair or replacement of fences, remove snow or ice; clean work areas).

MAJOR WORKER CHARACTERISTICS:

Knowledge of masonry; safety practices; addition, subtraction, multiplication & division. Skill in masonry & use of masonry tools & associated heavy equipment (e.g., concrete & mortar mixers, drills, jackhammers); rough carpentry; use of hand power tools. Ability to carry out instructions in written, oral or picture form; read short sentences with concrete vocabulary; read blueprints limited to work to be performed; read masonry plans; stand, walk & bend continuously; lift up to 50 lbs. repeatedly; move limbs/fingers easily to perform manual functions repeatedly; move whole body in continuous or heavy labor.

MINIMUM CLASS QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT:
