JOB DUTIES IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE: (These duties are illustrative only. Incumbents may perform some or all of these duties or other job-related duties as assigned.)

Operates machinery & equipment (e.g., shop smith, drill press, band saw, belt & rotary sander, air compressor, drill, industrial sewing machine) to rebuild, remodel, repair &/or design equipment (e.g., wheel chairs, arm & leg braces, eating utensils, lap trays, walkers, seat belts &/or time-out chairs).

Reviews work orders for appropriateness, prepares purchase requisitions to order equipment & supplies & prepares reports regarding work completed & in progress.

Attends treatment team meetings & assists in demonstrating use of new equipment to staff & patient.

MAJOR WORKER CHARACTERISTICS:

Knowledge of Medicaid equipment ordering regulations*; addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions & percentages. Skill in carpentry; upholstering; welding; operation of tools (e.g., shop smith, drill press, band saw, rotary sander, air compressor, drill, industrial sewing machine). Ability to interpret variety of instructions in written, oral, picture or schedule form; write routine business reports & maintain records following standard procedures; gather, collate & classify information about data, people or things; move limbs/fingers easily to perform manual functions repeatedly.
