**CLASS CONCEPT:**

The full performance level class works under general supervision & requires considerable skill in masonry trade in order to perform skilled masonry work in restoration, alteration, maintenance, repair & construction of masonry structures (e.g., monuments, marble, stone, plaster) on statehouse grounds.

**JOB DUTIES IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE: (These duties are illustrative only. Incumbents may perform some or all of these duties or other job-related duties as assigned.)**

Performs skilled masonry work in restoration, alteration, maintenance, repair & construction of masonry structures (e.g., monuments, marble, stone, plaster) on state house grounds, operates equipment (e.g., diamond saw, roto hammer, fork lift, front end loader) in order to perform masonry repairs (e.g., removes/replaces damaged stone; cuts replacement stone with diamond saw; mixes patching materials; custom mixes mortar; grinds loose or damaged mortar joints; repairs & cleans monuments; repairs damaged plaster; mixes, pours & lays concrete; lays bricks, block, stone or tile; caulking).

Assesses & field-measures damaged areas (e.g., marble, limestone, plaster, monuments); barricades & builds scaffolding or rig swing stages & sets up extension ladders for areas to be worked on per OSHA regulations; orders all materials for stone work (e.g., epoxy, stone setting materials).

Works with labs for testing of materials (e.g., stone, plaster, marble); writes construction, repair, maintenance estimates & work orders; attends job project meetings; prepares bid requests; reviews blue prints; reviews contractor work; assists in related construction projects; salts sidewalks; removes snow; performs &/or assists in plumbing, electrical, carpentry &/or small engine repair.

**MAJOR WORKER CHARACTERISTICS:**

Knowledge of masonry; safety practices related to masonry trade. Skill in operation of masonry tools, heavy equipment (e.g., diamond saw; roto hammer; forklift; front-end loader) & hand & power tools. Ability to assess damage to marble, stone, limestone &/or plaster; read short sentences with concrete vocabulary; add, subtract, multiply & divide whole numbers; prepare meaningful, concise & accurate reports; define problems, collect data, establish facts & draw valid conclusions; demonstrate strength to lift 60-90 lbs.

**MINIMUM CLASS QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT:**

48 mos. trg. or 48 mos. exp. in masonry as apprentice under supervision of journey mason.
