At the specialist level, incumbents assist in implementing & monitoring the program.

JOB DUTIES IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE: (These duties are illustrative only. Incumbents may perform some or all of these duties or other job-related duties as assigned.)

Assists in implementing & monitoring Ohio's Interstate Compact on Juveniles (i.e., Sections 2151.56 through 2151.61 of Revised Code) program which involves return of runaways & escapees to domicile state authorities & cooperative supervision of out-of-state probationers & parolees, responds to inquiries regarding program, maintains contact with institutions, courts, parents &/or guardians, compiles program data & recommends programs for &/or placement of youths with special needs.

Assists in youth intake processing; prepares case histories &/or summarizes youth admissions & early releases; prepares reports & maintains records.

MAJOR WORKER CHARACTERISTICS:

Knowledge of Sections 2151.56 through 2151.61 of Revised Code & Interstate Compact on Juveniles*; psychology, sociology or social work. Ability to define problems, collect data, establish facts & draw valid conclusions; handle sensitive contacts with agency officials & general public; use research methods to gather data; prepare meaningful & accurate reports.

MINIMUM CLASS QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT:

Completion of undergraduate core program in social or behavioral science or comparable field.

-Or 12 mos. exp. in position working with juveniles in correctional, court or rehabilitative system.

-Or alternative, equivalent evidence of the Major Worker Characteristics noted above.
