



**Blanket Endorsement for Expired Drivers' Licenses
Due to COVID-19**

Self-Insured Vehicle Liability Program

Date Issued: July 10, 2020

Expiration Date: Continuous until cancelled

Agency/Division: Statewide

Scope of Endorsement

Ohio's Bureau of Motor Vehicle (BMV) deputy registrar locations and BMV driver examination stations are now open. As part of Responsible RestartOhio, if your license, ID card, or vehicle registration (including plates and stickers) expired on or after March 9, 2020, your expiration date has been automatically extended until 90 days after Ohio's state of emergency ends or December 1, 2020, whichever comes first.

In accordance with this order, the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services, Office of Risk Management, will provide vehicle liability coverage to all state employees whose drivers' licenses expired on or after March 9, 2020 and are driving State of Ohio vehicles in the course of state business until 90 days after Ohio's state of emergency ends or December 1, 2020, whichever comes first. This extension of coverage applies only in instances where an employee's license is expired due to a birthdate, and no other court or BMV suspensions are in effect.

This endorsement supersedes all prior versions issued in response to COVID-19.

All other terms and conditions of VF-02 Self-Insured Vehicle Liability Program apply.
